This past week I had the opportunity to attend a Latin American Women's conference in Houston, Texas. A little over 1,000 women attended from as far as Argentina and Chile. It was inspiring at how many of the women there held multiple degrees and careers that I would have never imagined for a Hispanic woman to have. Some of the women I met were lawyers, psychologists, professors, writers, a veteran, medical professionals, and even others who advocate for Hispanic and/or low income communities. I don't think I am able to find the right words to express how seeing how much is possible for women, whose culture constantly attempts to keep them uneducated, with the right kind of support and opportunities made me feel. I can assure you it was a positive reaction, perhaps heart warming? No, not warming it was more like a burning, like a volcano erupted full of all sorts of emotions; relief, joy, etc.

At Mi Casa, although we do mostly assist Mexicans and Hondurans, we also see many others come through from Guatemala, Nicaragua, and El Salvador. We even had someone from Belize and Cuba! Sometimes it's hard to understand each other because there are still many cultural differences within each country. However it's a giddy feeling when someone doesn't think you'll understand their culture because not very many have but then you surprise them by bringing up their traditional foods, they see a trinket on one of our shelves that's from their country, or simply know something that has to do with their home country specifically. Not only does it make us feel good but it provides the person needing help that comfort knowing that we will take the time to learn about them and provide a service that best suits their needs.



During Project Transformation 2022, there was an intern, Gabe Ronan, from Brazil, that all the kids participating would rave about. I recall that one of our kids from Midweek Manna excitedly informed me that one of their teachers spoke Spanish. Since I wasn't very involved that year with PT, I wasn't able to see if he did speak Spanish for myself or if the kids assumed he did because technically he is Latino (but not Hispanic). Regardless if he did or not, the kids with Latino backgrounds were able to relate to him due to some similarities and learning from each other.

One of my main goals with our Midweek Manna kids and their parents is showing them that they are capable of achieving so much more than what they believe. When we have the seniors come in and fix their tables for the Senior Brunch at the end of the year, our Midweek Manna kids watch them with their eyes full of curiosity. In 2022, they were able to see college t-shirts, a drawing, high school diplomas, yearbooks, acceptance letters, a band poster, homecoming memories, band medals, trophies, different plaques, sashes, colorful cords and sashes, JROTC ribbons, soccer posters, pictures, and just soak in what kind of memories they could have and share when it's their turn to graduate.
