Liminal Space

The word "liminal" comes from the Latin word "limen," which means threshold. To be in the liminal space means "to be on the precipice of something new but not quite there yet." We heard this a lot during peak Covid when we didn't know what life was going to look like post-pandemic, but we all understood it wasn't going to look like it did before.

There are times in our lives when we find ourselves in these spaces. For example, when a loved one passes. My grandmother was the matriarch of our family. All of our holidays and gatherings were organized by her. As she got older, others would take the lead, but nothing was done without running it by her first. When she received a cancer diagnosis in July and passed away the following March, our family knew that nothing was going to be the same. But we had no idea what it would be like.

This liminal space is hard. We know change is coming, but we don't know what that change is. Sometimes, we are aware of this upcoming transitional period. I knew that I was going to seminary so that I could go into ministry. Now that I'm at the end of school, I know I'm going into a pulpit, but I have no idea where that might be or what that context might be. This is a liminal space of something new, but not quite yet.

We see this space in scripture as well. The Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years before going into the Promised Land. That had to be a liminal time for them. They were led out of slavery. They knew they weren't enslaved any longer, but they didn't know what was before them in the promised land.

It had to be a liminal time for the disciples and Jesus' followers between his burial and resurrection. The disciples knew that Jesus had been crucified and buried, but they didn't understand that he would be resurrected.


In both of these scripture references, God shows up in a spectacular way. Just the way God promised. Moses and Joshua knew the Israelites were going to the promised land. God promised that. Jesus knew he was going to be resurrected. God promised that.

Even in times of transition, God's promise to us remains.


